Competitor Definitions



Age Category of Competitors

Junior A & Junior B
Senior A & Senior B
Lightweight
Masters

Junior B

Age 16 and under to December 31 2010 inclusive
Born 1994 or later
If you are turning 17 in 2010 you must row Junior

Junior A

Age 18 and under to December 31 2010 inclusive
Born 1992 or later
If you are turning 19 in 2010 you must row Senior B

Senior B

Age 22 and under to December 31 2010 inclusive
Born 1988 or later
If you are turning 23 in 2010 you must row Senior

Senior A

Open to all ages

Adaptive

Refer to the Adaptive Rowing Classifications used by Rowing Canada and select the statement that best applies to your Adaptive rowing ability.

Coxswain

Racing / training experience limited to role of coxswain having coxed a rowing race in a sanctioned regatta at least once during the 2009 regatta season
There are no age or weight restrictions.

Youth

Age 13 and under on Race Day
Age on Race Day determines Race Category

University

Registered in a Full Time Program at a recognized Canadian or U.S. University or College

Parent / Offspring

Must be legal guardian or biologically related as per categories listed
Any combination of father/son, mother/son, father/daughter, mother/daughter, or grandparent

Lightweight

Male maximum weight of 165 lbs / 75 kg
Female maximum weight of 135 lbs / 61 kg

Masters

Must be 30 years of age or older on Race Day
Age is as of Race Day and determines Race Category
Medals will be awarded within 10 year age categories based on raw / unhandicapped scores in the Masters and Senior Masters Events and sufficient number of competitors. A medal winner must be faster than at least one other competitor. Medals will be awarded within 5 year age categories based on raw / unhandicapped scores in the Veteran Masters Events. Medals will be awarded in both the open weight and lightweight divisions.
